

ABA Therapy

At Ripple Effects Autism Learning Centers, we provide personalized, evidence-based Applied-Behavior-Analysis (ABA) services for young children with autism and their families.

Our goals are to:

- Enhance learning paths
- Gradually reduce the need for specialized services
- Ease transitions into traditional schools and social settings

Parent/Caregiver Guidance and Support

We partner with families to help children succeed at home and in the community.

Goals include:

- Equip parents/caregivers with strategies to support children with autism
- Address specific challenges faced by families
- Foster a collaborative partnership between professionals and families



Specific Goals of ABA

We focus on improving:

- Social skills
- Communication abilities
- Adaptive learning skills



We also aim to:

- Increase the number of learning opportunities for each child
- Prepare children for the transition to kindergarten or least restrictive environment

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)

Based on the science of learning and behavior analysis.

Behavior analysis helps us to understand:

- ☐ How behavior works
- ☐ How behavior is affected by the environment
- ☐ How learning takes place

ABA therapy applies our understanding of how behavior works to real situations.

Goals = increase behaviors that are helpful and decrease behaviors that are harmful or affect learning.



Applied Behavior Analysis

ABA therapy programs can help:

- Increase language and communication skills
- Improve attention, focus, social skills, memory, and academics
- Decrease problem behaviors

The methods of behavior analysis have been used and studied for decades.



ABA Treatment Includes

- Individualized assessment, treatment planning and oversight provided by a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA)
- Up to 35 hours per week of one-on-one intervention provided by a Behavior Technician
- Parents and caregivers receive ongoing training and support
- Skills are broken into tiny steps and practiced repeatedly in multiple environments
- The learner receives an abundance of positive reinforcement for demonstrating useful skills and socially appropriate behaviors.
- The learner receives no reinforcement for behaviors that pose harm or prevent learning

Applied Behavior Analysis

- More than 20 studies have established that intensive and long-term therapy using ABA principles improves outcomes for many, but not all, children with autism.
- These studies show gains in intellectual functioning, language development, daily living skills and social functioning
- Early intervention is key to best outcomes



How is it done?

ABA therapy uses observation, data collection, and the application of the principles of behavior to understand and change behavior, with a focus on teaching practical life skills. It is:

- Flexible and personalized
- Can be provided in various locations (home, school, community)
- Involves one-on-one or group teaching



Positive Reinforcement


- Increase behavior by using meaningful rewards
- Encourage behavior repetition
- · Rewards can include praise, toys, books, etc.
- Over time, this leads to meaningful behavior change.



The A-B-C Model

Understanding behavior through:

- 1. Antecedent: What happens before the behavior
- **2. Behavior**: The person's response to the antecedent
- 3. Consequence: What happens after the behavior



Planning and Ongoing Assessment

- A Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) customizes the ABA program based on skills, needs, interests, and preferences
- Detailed assessments help identify specific treatment goals
- Regular monitoring of progress through data collection
- Regular training and monitoring of behavior technicians (1:1)



Applied Behavior Analysis and Funding

- Michigan Insurance Mandate passed in 2013
 - Most insurance plans cover ABA therapy
 - Employers with self-funded plans are not required to provide coverage
 - Medicaid covers ABA at 100%
- Most insurance companies have strict rules regarding where patients can go to get a diagnosis
 - BCBSM must go to an Approved Autism Evaluation Center, 18 in the state, some with waitlists over 1 year long
 - Medicaid must go to Community Mental Health

<u>Clinical Supervisors -</u>

Behavior Analysts (BCBA)

- Master's or Doctoral Level
- Certified by Behavior Analysis Certification Board (BACB)
 - Assess behavior
 - Set goals
 - Create plans
 - Monitor progress
 - Supervise others
 - Maintain certification
- BCaBA another option

Behavior Technicians

- 18 years old
- High school diploma or equivalent
- Complete 40 hour training
- Background check

Registered Behavior Technicians (RBT)

- Pass competency Assessment
- Certification exam (BACB)
- Maintain supervision by BCBA

Apprenticeship

- Goal: Become a Registered Behavior Technician (RBT)
 - Most ABA centers and some insurance companies are requiring this credential
- Apprenticeship Specifications
 - 144 hours of classroom/online content-based instruction
 - 2000 hours of on-the-job training in ABA
 - Mentored by a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA), Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA), Lead Technician, or seasoned RBT
 - Scheduled wage increases for completing milestones
 - Once an RBT, continue receiving supervision for at least 5% of direct hours with a client
 - Can obtain their RBT at any time during the apprenticeship
